



# Archery World Championships



# Ulsan (KOR), 1-9 September

- About 500 participants will compete at the Ulsan Moonsu International Archery Centre.
- Archers will follow the regular competition format with a FITA Round in the qualifications. For more details please consult the World Cup competition format.
- The top 128 archers of each category will go into match play (12-arrow match).
- The top 16 teams will go into match play (24-arrow match, 3 members per team).
- Eight world champions will be crowned: women's and men's individual in Recurve and Compound; women's and men's team in Recurve and Compound.
- The FITA Congress will take place in Ulsan on 30-31 August.
- -> The first Outdoor Archery World Championships were held in 1931.




# Indoor World Championships

# Rzeszow (POL), 4-8 March

- About 350 participants will compete in the City Arena of Rzeszow.
- In qualifications, archers shoot 60 arrows at a 40 cm target face at a distance of 18 meters (only rings from 6 points to 10 points count).
- The top 32 archers of each category will go into match play (12-arrow match).
- The top 16 teams will go into match play (24-arrow match, 3 members per team).
- Sixteen world champions will be crowned: women's and men's individual in Recurve and Compound; women's and men's team in Recurve and Compound (including Youth titles).
  - --> The first Indoor Archery World Championships were held in 1991.









Youth World Championships



Ogden, Utah (USA), 11-19 July

Main Qualifier for the Singapore 2010 Youth Olympic Games (YOG)

- About 500 participants will compete at the Weber State University in Ogden, located near the historical sight of the completion of the transcontinental railroad in 1896—where the US railroad lines from the East and from the West came together.
- -> The finals will take place in downtown Ogden.
- There are two age classes: Cadets (U16) and Juniors (U18)
  - Archers will follow the regular competition format with a FITA Round in the qualifications (for more details please consult World Cup competition format).
  - -> The top 128 archers of each category will go into match play (12-arrow match).
  - ----> The top 16 teams will go into match play (24-arrow match, 3 members per team).
  - -> A total of 16 world titles will be awarded.

#### Youth Olympic Games Qualifications

- Only athletes born between 1 January 1992 and 31 December 1993 are eligible to shoot in the special Youth Olympic Games qualifying tournament in Ogden (individual matches).
- 17 boys and 17 girls will earn a spot for the YOG (maximum 1 boy and 1 girl per country) in Ogden.
- A total of 32 boys and 32 girls will compete in the YOG. For more details, please consult www.archery.org.

- The Para-Archery World Championships will be shot in the same format as the other FITA championships, namely a FITA Round followed by an Olympic Round. They will be held under FITA and IPC Rules and sanctioned by FITA.

# Archery World Cup 2009

From the Stages—to the World Cup Final!

- Four Stages allow archers to gather points.
- -> At the end of the four Stages, the top four archers in each category qualify for the World Cup Final.
- ---> Prize Money will be awarded—over 200,000 USD!
- Archery World Cup Final 2006 took place at the Mayapan Pyramids in Merida (MEX) - photo above.
- Archery World Cup Final 2007 took place at the Madinat Jumeirah in Dubai (UAE) - photo left.
- Archery World Cup Final 2008 took place in Lausanne (SUI), the Olympic Capital – photo below.

Furthermore, World Cup there is Nation Ranking will be determined by the results of all individuals and teams. This ranking is made at the conclusion of Stage 4.







# World Cup Competition Format

About 300 archers participate in each World Cup Stage.

#### **The Qualifications**

- All athletes shoot a FITA Round in the qualification/ranking round. 4 rounds of 36 arrows, respectively at distances of: 90, 70, 50 and 30 meters for Men 70, 60, 50 and 30 meters for Women
- The maximum number of points is 1440.
- -> Archers are ranked based on the number of points.

#### **The Elimination Matches**

- The top 64 archers per category from the Qualifications are ranked and paired.
- The number 1 qualifier (seed) shoots against number 64, and so on... in head-to-head, single elimination competition.
- For the rounds of 1/32, 1/16, and 1/8, archers shoot 2x6 (12 total) arrows at a target a distance of 70 meters away.
- Archers have 4 minutes to shoot 6 arrows.
- The maximum score is 120 points. The archer with the best score advances to the next round.

*In case of a tie: archers shoot 1 extra arrow each in a sudden death shoot-off until one archer wins. The best score is used as the tie-breaker in the first or second extra-arrow. On the third arrow, the shortest distance (measurement) to the centre of the target decides the winner.* 



# Is the formation of the

#### **Finals Matches**

- The Finals Matches start with the quarterfinals.
- Archers shoot 4x3 arrows at a target 70 meters away.
- Archers alternate shooting each arrow. They have 30 seconds to shoot one arrow.
- -> Maximum score is 120 points. The best score wins.

*Elimination and Finals Matches are like a one-day tennis tournament! The head-to-head competition combines simplicity, excitement and suspense!*

The ranking at the end of each Stage is based on the score that the archers achieved in their last match. For example, the four losers of the quarterfinals will be ranked from  $5^{th}$  to  $8^{th}$  based on their score from the quarterfinal round.

#### **Team Competitions**

- Each nation with 3 athletes of the same gender in the same division can also compete in team competition.
- In the team matches, the each team shoots 24 arrows— 4 ends of 6 arrows. They have only 2 minutes in which to shoot 6 arrows. Each team member shoots 2 arrows per end, shooting only one arrow at a time. Teams alternate shooting after every 3 arrows.
- A maximum of 16 teams compete in matches based on results of the qualifications.
- Results of the Team competition count solely for World Cup Nations Ranking.





# Equipment

# Target

The target face is 122 cm in diameter. The target face is attached to the target butt.

The target face has 10 concentric scoring rings. Each ring is 6.1 cm in width. Hence, the inside scoring ring (the 10 ring) is 12.2 cm in diameter. The outside scoring ring is worth 1 point and the inside ring is worth 10 points.

There are five colours on the target—white for the two outside rings (1 and 2-point rings), then black (3 and 4), light blue (5 and 6), red (7 and 8), and gold (9 and 10). Should an arrow land on the line dividing two rings, it scores the higher score.

(FYI...Within the 10 ring is a smaller, lighter circle called the X10. The very centre of the target is called the bull's eye.)

The target is positioned so that its centre is 130 cm above ground give or take 5 cm. A wind flag is positioned above the centre of each butt. This flag is essential to archers because wind affects their aim. A windsock is also visible on the Field of Play.

# Arrows

Arrows are usually made of a combination of aluminium and carbon fibre. The arrowhead or point is the part of the arrow that sticks into the target. The nock is the end of the arrow that fits onto the bow string. The feathers on an arrow are called the fletching or fletch.

Every arrow must be identified with an archer's name or initials.

Arrows can fly at more than 250 km/h.





Two kinds of bows are used for the World Cup events:

- **Recurve:** the only type of bow allowed in Olympic competition—its limbs curve away from the archer. It is also called a Classic Bow.
- **Compound:** this bow has pulleys and cables to make the holding weight less than half of the draw weight.

The bow is constructed with high-tech fibre. Modern risers (handles) are usually made of aluminium or carbon fibre, the limbs are laminated of fibreglass, carbon fibre and a wood or synthetic core. The string is a high-strength, low-stretch material. Other features on a bow include a stabilizer, a sight, upper and lower limbs, a handle riser, a grip, a nock point, an arrow rest, a plunger button and a clicker.

Archery competitions at the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games were a true success with three times the top 5 audience of the day across all Olympic sports (total cumulative viewers for these three broadcasts on CCTV China only: 229 millions!).

The International Archery Federation (FITA) was founded in 1931 at a meeting in Lwow, Poland. Seven founding nations were present: France, Italy, Hungary, Poland, Sweden, the United States and the former Czechoslovakia. The head office for FITA is in Lausanne, Switzerland. In 2005, Prof. Dr. Ugur ERDENER (TUR) was elected president.

According to its Constitution, FITA's main objective is "to promote and encourage archery throughout the world in conformity with the Olympic principles."

FITA makes and interprets the FITA Rules; supervises the organization of World Championships and other international competitions; and promotes archery through the media and sponsors.

Archery was part of the Olympic Movement from 1900–1920 and has been permanently a part of Olympic Games since 1972, when the IOC returned the elegant sport of archery to the Olympic program. Women competed in the 1904 Olympics, making archery one of the first sports competitions to include women. In 1961, FITA became the first International Sports Federation to elect a woman president.

FITA has held World Championships since 1931. Since 1991, FITA has included eight disciplines. In 2006, FITA launched the Archery World Cup.


